

Local COVID-19 vaccination rates are good news


New data vaccination data shows our communities are responding well to the COVID-19 vaccination program. The following data shows the percentage of people per postcode, aged 12 years and over, who have had their first and second doses of a COVID-19 vaccine (as at 1 October 2021).

First dose  83%


Second dose  60%


Underbool (3509)

First dose  94%


Second dose  65%

Second dose  59%

Remember – both our Ouyen and Sea Lake medical clinics continue to provide COVID-19 vaccinations. To arrange your vaccination, please contact our medical clinics in Sea Lake (phone 5070 2155) or Ouyen (phone 5092 1168).

If you haven't had your vaccination, please make an appointment, and if you have friends and family who are not vaccinated, encourage them to get vaccinated. The more people who get vaccinated, the greater the protection for those vaccinated and the whole community.

Accessing proof of vaccination

The easiest way to get proof you have had your COVID-19 vaccination is through your MyGov account (you will need your own, individual email address to set up your MyGov account) or the Express Plus Medicare app on your phone. While we used to be able to help people get this information when undertaking our vaccination clinics, we are increasingly busy administering vaccinations and can no longer do this. However, we do have a flyer with easy to follow instructions available from our medical clinics. This includes the option of phoning 1800 653 809 if you need assistance. If you phone this number, you can also get your immunisation record printed and posted to you (extremely helpful if you don't have easy access to the internet). Please pass this information on to those who may find it useful.
