Not Feeling So Great?

A reminder that COVID-19 symptoms extend beyond the common sore throat, runny nose, fever. This is why we have worked really hard to get a vaccinated community – so we can be open and honest on this virus.

There is no stigma around a positive test result now – so please test whenever you feel unwell, regardless of your particular symptoms.

A reminder of the expanded range of COVID-19 symptoms (from the Chief Health Officer) is: Fever, chills, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath, runny nose, or loss or changes in sense of smell or taste, headache, myalgia, stuffy nose, nausea, vomiting or diarrhoea.

Visits to Aged Care

If you are visiting a resident in Aged Care, you may be asked to take a RAT test before you enter. We are ramping up testing for visitors as a precautionary measure.

We are doing all we can to reduce the risk of COVID-19 exposures to our vulnerable residents, such as wearing N95 masks and having visits outdoors wherever possible.

This is an additional protection, so please understand that if you or members of your family are asked to undertake a RAT test before your visit, this for the protection of our residents.

Rapid Antigen Tests Available

If community members are having difficulty accessing RAT tests for any reason you are welcome to contact MTHCS to discuss your needs. Anyone requiring access to RAT tests after hours, who are symptomatic or who need support to access a RAT test can contact our MTHCS urgent care (24 hours, 7 days a week) or our medical clinics (during business hours).

Walk-in Boosters at Mildura

If you are due for your Booster shot, or your kids are eligible for their vaccination, SCHS are currently running a Booster Blitz Program.

Kids clinics are available for ages 5-11.

Booster clinics are available for ages 16+, at least three months after your 2nd dose.
