Mallee Track Road Trauma Prevention Forum

Mildura Rural City Council and Ouyen Inc are hosting a community discussion around road trauma and community safety

6.30pm Thursday 3 March Ouyen Community Centre

Topics include community concern about drug and drink-driving across the Mallee Track region, and presentations from Dr Travis Taggert and Victoria Police with real life scenarios based on the impact of driving while using drugs and alcohol. This event is for people aged 16 and older, and will include the presentation of sensitive and potentially confronting material.
