Protecting your hearing is really important, especially if you work with power tools and heavy machinery. That's why, at MTHCS, we provide readily available hearing protection and ensure hearing tests are arranged for our maintenance staff every two years. Protecting your hearing can be as simple as wearing earmuffs. They help reduce noise, they are affordable, and many have built in radio and bluetooth options. Make hearing protection part of your work uniform and arrange regular hearing tests for early detection of any problems.
