Visitors welcome in our aged care communities

Visitors are welcome to visit residents in our aged care communities, in line with Victoria's current health and safety measures:

- Residents can have up to five visitors per day
 if all visitors show evidence of a negative
 result from a rapid antigen test taken on the
 day of the visit. This test does not need to be
 taken at the care facility.
- If rapid antigen tests cannot be obtained, the resident may have up to two visitors a day.
- All visitors must wear a face mask, unless excepted.

We continue to ask all visitors phone ahead to help us ensure we can assist where required.
