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Winter booster for COVID-19

The Australian Technical Advisory Group on Immunisation (ATAGI) has updated its recommendations for winter dose COVID-19 vaccinations. The updated recommendations are:

- Adults aged 50 to 64 years are now recommended to receive a winter booster dose of a COVID-19 vaccine.
- Adults aged 30 to 49 years can receive a winter booster dose of a COVID-19 vaccine, however the benefit for people in this age group is less certain.
- The interval recommended between a recent COVID infection or the first booster dose and a winter booster dose is now 3 months (reduced from 4 months).

No limits on visitors to aged care

- **Nurse on Call:** Phone **1300 60 60 24** for immediate health advice from a registered nurse — available 24/7.
- **Health Direct:** Phone **1800 022 222** for medical advice after hours.
- **Instant Consult:** Health consultations with Australian registered, fully qualified and experienced doctors via video call, anywhere in Australia.
