Winter booster for COVID-19

The Australian Technical Advisory Group on Immunisation (ATAGI) has updated its recommendations for winter dose COVID-19 vaccinations. The updated recommendations are:

- Adults aged 50 to 64 years are now recommended to receive a winter booster dose of a COVID-19 vaccine.
- Adults aged 30 to 49 years can receive a winter booster dose of a COVID-19 vaccine, however the benefit for people in this age group is less certain.
- The interval recommended between a recent COVID infection or the first booster dose and a winter booster dose is now 3 months (reduced from 4 months).

Keep Urgent Care centres for emergencies

Our Urgent Care Centres in Ouyen and Sea Lake are not GP clinics and are not for use by people with non-urgent medical needs. If you need to see a doctor for non-urgent care, but are unable to get an appointment, consider using the following options:

- Nurse on Call: Phone 1300 60 60 24 for immediate health advice from a registered nurse — available 24/7.
- Health Direct: Phone 1800 022 222 for medical advice after hours.
- Instant Consult: Health consultations with Australian registered, fully qualified and experienced doctors via video call, anywhere in Australia. Medical certificates, prescription and repeat prescriptions can be provided. Find out more online at
