Risk of viruses 'very high'

Victoria's Health department is continuing to warn about the increased risk of mosquito-borne viruses in the state's north.

According to the department, there have been more detections of Murray Valley encephalitis (MVE) virus in mosquitoes trapped at multiple locations across northern Victoria.

These results indicate a significant risk to people in these areas, including northern Victoria's inland river regions.

The risk area for MVE virus is similar to that for Japanese encephalitis virus (JEV) and the risk of human cases in the coming weeks is very high. Residents and people visiting our region are strongly advised to take measures to reduce the risk of mosquito bites:

- Wear an appropriate repellent at all times when outdoors.
- Cover up wear long, loose-fitting, lightcoloured clothing.
- Avoid time spent outdoors at dusk and dawn as much as possible.
- Eliminate breeding sites by emptying out any standing water near your home.
