Changes to COVID-19 rules

Recent changes to COVID-19 rules are now in place, which include:

- Face masks are no longer required in airports, but are still required in sensitive settings such as hospitals and care facilities.
- Positive cases must still isolate for seven days from the day of the positive test result, but may now leave home to drive a household member directly to or from school or work without leaving their vehicle.

Montessori at MTHCS

In an exciting step forward for MTHCS, the first part of our Montessori model of care training is now complete and we are looking forward to putting our learnings into action! In a Montessori Care Community people are supported to be as independent as possible and to make their own choices in an environment of respect and dignity. We are introducing the Montessori model of care to our residential aged care communities, social support groups and other community services. This approach will help improve the fabulous care we already offer by focusing more on individual strengths and meaningful engagement. In recent weeks, MTHCS staff members have undertaken foundational training in the Montessori approach and learnt how to apply this model of care. Staff members have been overwhelmingly positive about the training and we are also grateful for the support we have received from residents and their families. To begin with, we will be focusing on preparing our residential aged care environments in a way that supports memory loss by including signs and memory prompts, as well as a range of meaningful activities, based on a person's life story. Activities may include gardening, arranging flowers, pouring drinks, folding linen or matching objects to pictures. The focus will be on finding activities that are meaningful to the person, and giving them opportunity to enjoy an enriched life.
