#### **Ouyen Community Gathers to raise Dementia Awareness**

A good deal of thanks goes out to MTHCS volunteer Sue Gilchrist and the Community Service team's Vanessa Morrish for organising a gathering of over 70 community members to listen to speaker Bertilla Campbell from Dementia Australia. What became immediately apparent was the comradery of the assembled group as carers of loved ones who were currently dealing with dementia or relatives of those that had passed talked together. The recent loss of Sue's sister in law inspired her to create over 200 crochet purple hearts for the crowd to wear over their own hearts and remember. "It's so important that we gather and share our experiences. And now the community knows who we are, they can approach us with questions and reach out to Vanessa for assistance. You really don't know who could be suffering silently, so the more we speak about this terrible disease the better." said Sue Gilchrist. Vanessa and Bertilla led the way from Ouyen Lake's BBQ area up to the Dementia Garden for community members to plant their messages and find peace in their shared journey.

#### **SEA LAKE YOUTH CONNECT & TRAUMA RECOVERY ART** PROJECT AS CARINYA OPENS IT'S DOORS TO THE PUBLIC

If you get the opportunity to pop into Sea Lake's Neighbourhood House at Carinya and view the artwork created by Tyrrell College students you won't be disappointed!

Sea Lake and the surrounding towns have recently faced the loss of several community members, compounded by the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic. In these difficult time, art can serve as a valuable medium for expression and comfort, providing individuals with the means to process their emotions and regain control over their personal narratives.

This project was designed to offer the youth of Sea Lake and district an opportunity to convey their emotions through art, specifically through a series of "Paste Ups" displayed on the walls of the new Sea Lake Neighbourhood House precinct, 'Carinya'.

With the support of the funding a large-format printer and a variety of art materials were procured. Over the course of six weeks, students from years 7 to 10 engaged in the project, creating digital artworks that represented their personal interest, relationships and experiences. Some participants also chose to honor and symbolize loved ones they had

Once completed, these digital artworks were printed in large format and further embellished using pencils, paint, alcohol ink pens, acrylic paint pens, and gold leaf.


