


THE BENEFITS OF PETS AT OUYEN CHILDCARE IS SHINING BRIGHT

The passion of one educator at Ouyen childcare has gained support and praise from parents, educators and most importantly the children. Jo Grayling had a vision of introducing pets into Ouyen childcare, ensuring that her vision would be beneficial to all, Jo spent time researching articles that identified the benefits of animals in childcare. speaking with expert trained animal therapist, and linking the learning benefits with the National Quality standards and early years learning framework. Jo then presented all her evidence to her co-educators asking for support to move forward with her vision, everyone was 100 percent on board. Risk management plans were completed before presenting her vision to families who again provided positive support and encouragement. Jo found the benefits of having pets at childcare range from enriched learning opportunities, improving emotional and wellbeing for both children and staff. The children care for the pets teaching them to become responsible for others. Developing bonds with the pets help children to develop empathy.

Since the introduction of Misty the rabbit, Hedgehog and Toffee the Guinea Pigs the positive change in children's emotions and behaviours have been evident.

Children who normally would have separation anxiety from parents at drop offs are now walking in excited to start their day, on arrival children take their parents to make sure the pets have plenty of food and water, with the children feeling relaxed and safe they happily say good bye to their carer then continue on with their day. Educators have noticed that parents are becoming less rushed to leave the centre taking the time to stop and talk with their children at either the Rabbits or Guinea Pigs homes.
